## CHINESE MEDICINE ORDINANCE (Chapter 549)

## ORDER MADE BY THE CHINESE MEDICINE PRACTITIONERS BOARD OF THE CHINESE MEDICINE COUNCIL OF HONG KONG

Notice is hereby given that the Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board of the Chinese Medicine Council of Hong Kong, after an inquiry on 14 February 2022 conducted pursuant to section 91(2) of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance (Chapter 549, Laws of Hong Kong), was satisfied that the following charges against CHAN William, listed Chinese medicine practitioner (Listing No.: L08059), are proved:—

In the course of treatment of a patient from 9 to 16 June 2020,

- (i) failed to discharge his professional responsibility to the patient, in contravention of section 2(1) of Part 3 of the Code of Conduct for Listed Chinese Medicine Practitioners; and
- (ii) did not establish and maintain medical record for patient, in contravention of section 4(2) of Part 3 of the Code of Conduct for Listed Chinese Medicine Practitioners; and
- (iii) did not issue prescription to the patient, in contravention of section 4(5) of Part 3 of the Code of Conduct for Listed Chinese Medicine Practitioners.

For the above established charges, listed Chinese medicine practitioner CHAN William was found to be in breach of the conditions imposed by the Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board on his practice of Chinese medicine under section 90(3)(a) of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance. The Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board decided on 14 February 2022 to remove CHAN William from the list of listed Chinese medicine practitioners maintained by the Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board under section 90 of the Chinese Medicine Ordinance with effect from 14 February 2022.
