

## ROADS (WORKS, USE AND COMPENSATION) ORDINANCE (Chapter 370)

(Notice under section 18)

TUNG CHUNG NEW TOWN EXTENSION—DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION  
(MA WAN CHUNG ROAD WORKS)

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close temporarily sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, amenity areas and central reserves/traffic islands within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. RD/GZ001 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, and as amended by Amendment Plans Nos. RD/GZ001A and RD/GZ001A/LEGEND ('the Amendment Plans') and described in the amendment scheme annexed thereto. The Plan and scheme were referred to in G.N. 6852 published on 15 September 2017 and 22 September 2017. The Amendment Plans and amendment scheme were referred to in G.N. 3765 published on 25 May 2018 and 1 June 2018. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that from 17 May 2024 to 16 May 2025, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, amenity areas and central reserves/traffic islands to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve the construction of carriageways, footpaths, cycle track, central reserves/traffic islands, pedestrian crossings and slope.

A copy of the order, the Plan and the Amendment Plans may be inspected by members of the public free of charge at the following offices and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:—

This notice will be affixed on or near the affected carriageways, footpaths, amenity areas and central reserves/traffic islands on 3 May 2024.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Ordinance may serve upon the Secretary for Transport and Logistics a written claim, which can be submitted *via* one of the following means, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure, extinction, modification or restriction:—
