

LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ORDINANCE (Chapter 159)

ORDER THAT A BARRISTER BE SUSPENDED FROM PRACTISING  
LI, SAI KEUNG

In accordance with section 37A(2) of the Legal Practitioners Ordinance (Chapter 159), I hereby give notice that the Respondent, LI Sai Keung, has filed a Notice of Appeal on 6 September 2022 to the Court of Appeal against the Decisions of the Barristers Disciplinary Tribunal ('Tribunal') dated 9 July 2021, 24 February 2022 and 20 July 2022 ('the Appeal'). It was ordered in the Tribunal's Decision dated 20 July 2022 that:—

- (1) The Respondent is suspended from practising as a member of the Bar for a period of two months;
- (2) The Respondent do pay the Applicant
  - (i) the costs of and incidental to Complaint 2 and the costs of any prior inquiry or investigation in relation to the matters thereto; and
  - (ii) the costs thrown away by the adjournment of the hearing on 18 August 2021; to be taxed if not agreed on a party to party basis;
- (3) There be no order as to costs in relation to Complaint 1;
- (4) The Re-Amended Complaints, the Decision on Liability, and this decision on sentence and costs be published by way of a Bar Circular and also to be published on the Bar's website in the part which is accessible by the public generally for three months;
- (5) The Decision on the Respondent's Application for Dismissal of Complaints, Stay of Proceedings and Adjournment, the Decision on Liability, and the Reasons for Sentence and Costs (collectively as the 'Decisions') be sent to the complainant and the Registrars of the High Court and of the District Court, the Chief Judge of the High Court, the Chief District Judge, the Chief Magistrate, all Members of the Barristers Disciplinary Tribunal Panel, the Department of Justice (the Secretary for Justice, the Civil Litigation Unit and the Legal Aid, the Administrator of the Duty Lawyer Service and the Official Receiver's Office;
- (6) A copy of the Decisions be kept at the Bar Secretariat and a copy of the same will be available to the public upon request; and
- (7) There be liberty to apply.

The Court of Appeal on 23 May 2024 ordered that the Appeal be dismissed with costs to the Applicant to be taxed if not agreed.

The Order of the Court of Appeal dated 23 May 2024 and the Tribunal's Decisions dated 9 July 2021, 24 February 2022 and 20 July 2022 were filed by the Solicitors for the Bar Council 18 June 2024.
