PWP ITEM NO. 703TH DUALLING OF HIRAM'S HIGHWAY BETWEEN CLEAR WATER BAY ROAD AND MARINA COVE AND IMPROVEMENT TO LOCAL ACCESS TO HO CHUNG

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, the Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has ordered under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) ('the Ordinance') to close temporarily sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, central medians/refuge islands and amenity areas within the limit of works area as shown on Plans Nos. 91022-GAZ-0001 to 91022-GAZ-0003 ('the Plans') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, and as amended by Amendment Plans Nos. 91022-GAZ-0004 to 91022-GAZ-0006 ('the Amendment Plans') and described in the amendment scheme annexed thereto, and as modified by Modification Plan No. 91022-GAZ-0007 ('the Modification Plan'). The Plans and scheme were referred to in G.N. 1665 published on 26 March 2010 and 1 April 2010. The Amendment Plans and amendment scheme were referred to in G.N. 918 published on 11 February 2011 and 18 February 2011. The Modification Plan was referred to in G.N. 7330 published on 11 November 2011 and 18 November 2011. The Permanent Secretary for Transport and Logistics has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance that from 29 October 2022 to 31 December 2022, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the sections of the existing carriageways, footpaths, central medians/refuge islands and amenity areas to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The works to be carried out in association with this closure mainly involve improvement of an existing section of Hiram's Highway between Clear Water Bay Road and New Hiram's Highway, widening of a section of Hiram's Highway between Nam Pin Wai roundabout and Pak Wai, provision of a vehicular bridge across Ho Chung Channel, provision of a footbridge, improvement of Ho Chung Road and Luk Mei Tsuen Road, provision of noise barriers and other ancillary works.

A copy of the order, the Plans, the Amendment Plans and the Modification Plan may be inspected by members of the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:—

This notice will be affixed on or near the affected carriageways, footpaths, central medians/refuge islands and amenity areas on 21 October 2022.

Any person entitled to compensation under the Ordinance may serve upon the Secretary for Transport and Logistics a written claim, which can be submitted *via* one of the following means, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure, extinction, modification or restriction:—
