## INSPECTION OF THE 2019 PROVISIONAL REGISTERS AND THE OMISSIONS LISTS

Pursuant to sections 25 and 29 of the Electoral Affairs Commission (Registration) (Electors for Legislative Council Functional Constituencies) (Voters for Election Committee Subsectors) (Members of Election Committee) Regulation (Cap. 541B) (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulation"), it is hereby notified that—

- (a) a copy of the functional constituencies provisional register;
- (b) a copy of the subsector provisional register;
- (c) a copy of the functional constituencies omissions list containing the personal particulars or relevant particulars of persons who are no longer eligible to have their names included or who do not wish to remain registered in the functional constituencies register; and
- (d) a copy of the subsector omissions list containing the personal particulars or relevant particulars of persons who are no longer eligible to have their names included or who do not wish to remain registered in the subsector register.

are now available for public inspection during ordinary business hours from Monday to Friday from 1 August to 25 August 2019, both days inclusive<sup>1</sup>. The places for inspection are as follows—

- (d) Yau Tsim Mong Home Affairs Enquiry Centre: Ground Floor, Mong Kok Government Offices, 30 Luen Wan Street, Mong Kok, Kowloon;
- (e) Kwun Tong Home Affairs Enquiry Centre: Ground Floor, The Grande Building, 398 Kwun Tong Road, Kwun Tong, Kowloon;

- (g) Sha Tin Home Affairs Enquiry Centre: Ground Floor, Sha Tin Government Offices, 1 Sheung Wo Che Road, Sha Tin, New Territories.

A person who considers that a registered person is not eligible to be registered as an elector, a voter or an authorized representative, or be registered in the part in which that person's personal particulars or relevant particulars are recorded; or that a person who has been registered as an authorized representative has been wrongly so registered, may, under section 30 of the Regulation, lodge in person<sup>2</sup> at the office of the Electoral Registration Officer not later than 25 August 2019 a notice of objection in the specified form. The address of the office of the Electoral Registration Officer is set out in the form

Any person who has made an application for registration as an elector or voter but whose personal particulars or relevant particulars are not recorded in the provisional register; or whose appointment of authorized representative was refused by the Electoral Registration Officer; or whose personal particulars or relevant particulars are included in the omissions list; or who has a claim regarding his or her or its particulars in the provisional register may, under section 31 of the Regulation, lodge in presson at the office of the Electoral Registration Officer not later than 25 August 2019 a notice of claim in the specified form. The address of the office of the Electoral Registration Officer is set out in the form.

Special arrangement will be made by the Office of the Electoral Registration Officer to receive the relevant notices from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on 24 August (Saturday) and 25 August 2019 (Sunday).

A corporate elector or corporate voter who is dissatisfied with the decision of the Electoral Registration Officer not to register as an authorized representative a person appointed by it as a replacement or as a substitute may, under section 31A of the Regulation, lodge in person by its responsible person at the office of the Electoral Registration Officer a notice of appeal in the specified form. The address of the office of the Electoral Registration Officer is set out in the form.
