**NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING
TEMPORARY CLOSURE AND ALTERATION OF
WU KING ROAD AND ITS ADJACENT RAMP;
TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF AN ACCESS ROAD CONNECTING WU SHAN
ROAD AND FISH MARKETING ORGANIZATION CASTLE PEAK
WHOLESALE FISH MARKET, AND SECTIONS OF A FOOTPATH ADJACENT
TO TUEN MUN TYPHOON SHELTER, WU SHAN ROAD, WU CHUI ROAD
AND A FOOTPATH NEAR WU SHAN RECREATION PLAYGROUND; AND
TEMPORARY ALTERATION OF A SECTION OF A ROAD NEAR
WU SHAN RECREATION PLAYGROUND**

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Logistics has, by order made on 11 September 2024 (the 'Order'), authorized:—

- (I) the temporary closure and alteration of Wu King Road and its adjacent ramp, as delineated and shown in red on the Plans numbered TMSE/G05/0004/2 and TMSE/G06/0004/2, with details as follows:
 - (a) from 12:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. on 31 to 40 days during the period from 20 October 2024 to 19 October 2025, with all carriageway, parts of the footpath and its adjacent ramp widths temporarily closed; and
 - (b) during the period from 20 October 2024 to 19 October 2025, except the period specified in (I)(a) above, with the carriageway temporarily altered, and parts of the footpath and its adjacent ramp widths temporarily closed;
- (II) the temporary partial closure of the access road connecting Wu Shan Road and Fish Marketing Organization Castle Peak Wholesale Fish Market, as delineated and shown in pink on the Plan numbered TMSE/G05/0004/2;
- (III) the temporary partial closure of the section of the footpath adjacent to Tuen Mun Typhoon Shelter, as delineated and shown in purple on the Plan numbered TMSE/G05/0004/2;

- (IV) the temporary partial closure of the section of Wu Shan Road between a point about 210 metres west of its junction with Wu King Road and a point about 510 metres southeast of the junction, as delineated and shown in blue on the Plans numbered TMSE/G05/0004/2, TMSE/G06/0004/2 and TMSE/G07/0004/2;
- (V) the temporary partial closure of the section of Wu Chui Road between a point about 210 metres west of its junction with Wu King Road and a point about 310 metres east of the junction, as delineated and shown in orange on the Plan numbered TMSE/G06/0004/2;
- (VI) the temporary partial closure of the section of the footpath near Wu Shan Recreation Playground, as delineated and shown in yellow on the Plan numbered TMSE/G05/0004/2; and
- (VII) the temporary alteration of the section of the road near Wu Shan Recreation Playground, as delineated and shown in green on the Plan numbered TMSE/G05/0004/2,

during the period from 20 October 2024 to 19 October 2025 for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Tuen Mun South Extension. A description of the works to be carried out, the sections of the roads, the footpaths and the ramp to be affected and the manner in which they will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

A copy of the Order and the Plans numbered TMSE/G05/0004/2, TMSE/G06/0004/2 and TMSE/G07/0004/2 (the ‘Plans’) may be inspected by the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:–

A copy of this notice will be affixed on or near the roads, the footpaths and the ramp affected by the Order on 4 October 2024.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Logistics so as to reach the Secretary for Transport and Logistics before the expiration of one year from the closure/alteration of the relevant part or parts of the roads, the footpaths and the ramp or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the roads, the footpaths and the ramp affected by the Order. Claims can be submitted via one of the following means:–

Notice is hereby given that further closure/alteration of the same part or parts of the roads, the footpaths and the ramp or any of such part or parts may be required upon expiration of the Order. Details of any further order for closure/alteration will be published if and when such an order is made.
