**TUEN MUN SOUTH EXTENSION**

**NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING  
PERMANENT CLOSURE OF THE WU YUET BRIDGE ACROSS  
WU KING ROAD CONNECTING WU KING ESTATE AND  
WU KING ROAD GARDEN**

Notice is hereby given that under section 22(1) of the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519), the Deputy Secretary for Transport and Logistics has, by order made on 5 September 2024 (the ‘Order’), authorized the permanent closure of the Wu Yuet Bridge across Wu King Road connecting Wu King Estate and Wu King Road Garden, as delineated and shown in pink on the Plan numbered TMSE/G06/0007/1 with effect from 19 October 2024 for the purposes of or incidental to the railway scheme of the Tuen Mun South Extension. A description of the works to be carried out, the footbridge to be affected and the manner in which it will be affected is given in the Schedule below.

A copy of the Order and the Plan numbered TMSE/G06/0007/1 (the ‘Plan’) may be inspected by the public free of charge at the following places and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:-

A copy of this notice will be affixed on or near the footbridge affected by the Order on 4 October 2024.

Any person having a compensatable interest under the Railways Ordinance (Chapter 519) may serve a written claim upon the Secretary for Transport and Logistics so as to reach the Secretary for Transport and Logistics before the expiration of one year from the closure of the relevant part or parts of the footbridge or the extinction, modification or restriction of his private right in respect of the relevant part or parts of the footbridge affected by the Order. Claims can be submitted via one of the following means:-

*Description of the works and the manner in which the footbridge will be affected*

Wu Yuet Bridge across Wu King Road connecting Wu King Estate and Wu King Road Garden, as delineated and shown in pink on the Plan numbered TMSE/G06/0007/1.

The footbridge deck, staircase and ramp will be permanently closed for demolition to facilitate the construction of the railway station and the associated railway facilities of the Tuen Mun South Extension.
